JULIE WARDLE MEDAL

The Central Rivers Board were thrilled to announce earlier this year that, after extensive consultation and careful consideration, the Central Murray A Grade Best and Fairest award was to be formally named the Julie Wardle Medal.

Julie is a truly deserving recipient of this honour, with one of the most illustrious netball careers ever seen in the Central Murray.

Julie started playing netball with the Lake Boga Netball Club in 1983, with a stint at Swan Hill Netball Club in the early-mid 2000s, before playing out the remainder of her netball days at Tooleybuc Manangatang.

Julie won her first League A Grade Best and Fairest in 1988 while playing with Lake Boga and went on to win a further 8 League A Grade Best and Fairest Awards in 1990, 1994, 1996, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2009 & 2012. She was also runner up on five occasions, including her last one in 2018 at an impressive 48 years old.

At club level she has won 8 A Grade best and fairest awards with Tooleybuc Manangatang, 4 with Swan Hill and 5 at Lake Boga – along with a host of runner up awards in the years she didn't quite win the top honour.

Julie is also a premiership player and coach, having won 4 A Grade premierships as a playing coach, all with Swan Hill FNC, in 2003 and then 3 in a row 2005, 2006 and 2007. She has also been named as best on court in the grand final on 2 occasions, while playing for Tooleybuc Manangatang in 2009 and 2013.

Julie has represented the Central Murray in interleague netball on numerous occasions and was coach of the Open Women's interleague team in 2011 and 2012.

Julie has been a regular feature in the Team of the Year throughout her career and added to her list of achievements in 2020, with selection in the Central Murray A Grade Team of the Decade.

All the clubs that have been associated with Julie have said she is a terrific person to have around the club; not a year went by that she didn't volunteer her time as an umpire, coach, scorer or timekeeper and this year was no different, with Julie picking up a whistle again in 2023.

Julie spent time on the Central Murray Netball Board of Management and was also recognised as the Central Murray Identity of the Year in 2013 for her contributions to the football and netball community.

Over the years, Julie has been an incredible sportswoman on the court, as well as making some amazing connections off court within the Central Murray Community. We congratulate Julie on this amazing honour and look forward to awarding the Julie Wardle Medal for years to come.
